VISIT TO READING ABBEY

The Quenington Society has organised a stunning visit to Reading Abbey and Museum on June 28th . Leaving Quenington Green at 10.00 am

Reading Abbey was established by Henry I in 1125 and he was buried there in 1136. The church was also intended as a pilgrimage church and was given a hand of St James by the founder.

Henry VIII. executed its Abbot and did his best to destroy one of the greatest Abbeys in Europe. Its site must be the least known. Its magnificent ruins have been newly re-opened.

The interesting museum contains the only copy of the Bayeux Tapestry, made with great attention to detail in the 19th century. There are also important links with the church of St. Swithin in Quenington.

A minibus will be arranged and we have been given permission to park by the church of St James, Pugin's first essay in medieval architecture. He reset several of the remains of the Abbey in the building.

We are being guided by two outstanding local historians.

Don't wait for the French to bring over the Bayeux Tapestry come and see it in Reading!
