

FROM (ONE OF) THE VICAR(S)

Andrew Cinnamond is now back from his Sabbatical – more details of that in a forthcoming edition of this magazine.

Meanwhile ...as many of you know I'm currently ministering in six villages (Coln, Hatherop, Quenington, Kempsford, Whelford and Castle Eaton). Their combined population is about the same as the single parish where I was vicar until four years ago (and so are their combined congregations).

There's something very special about each of our small villages having its own church. Even in these more mobile days, I find myself burying those who have lived in the village all their lives .. and sometimes christening or marrying those whose roots here go back generations.

And in a small community, there's a neighbourliness and a sense of belonging which makes village life (usually) a delight. This coming month our fetes and Harvest Suppers give glimpses of the community life that we value highly and of which the church is a part.

At the same time, though, there are pressures on this way of running our churches. Other denominations, like the schools and post offices, have long since consolidated their resources on fewer more economic centres; but our villages still each have a Church of England building at their heart – offering weekly worship for those who choose, but an occasional service for all .. a few times a year or even just a few times in a lifetime.

To continue doing this, we need financial support from a much wider circle in the village than our weekly worshippers. Many of our churches tiptoe on the verge of insolvency, because it needs more than a couple of dozen people to pay for the maintenance of each historic, and expensive, building.

I'm entirely unembarrassed in asking villagers at large to pay towards our churches. The regular worshippers will pay my wages, and our other ministerial costs .. but to have the church building here at all needs commitment and generosity from many more villagers than those who go regularly to services. (And no money comes from outside our villages to pay for the church.) So: are you yet a regular giver to your village church? If not, contact me or any church-member to find out how to help us .. or in a few decades we shall not be here any more.

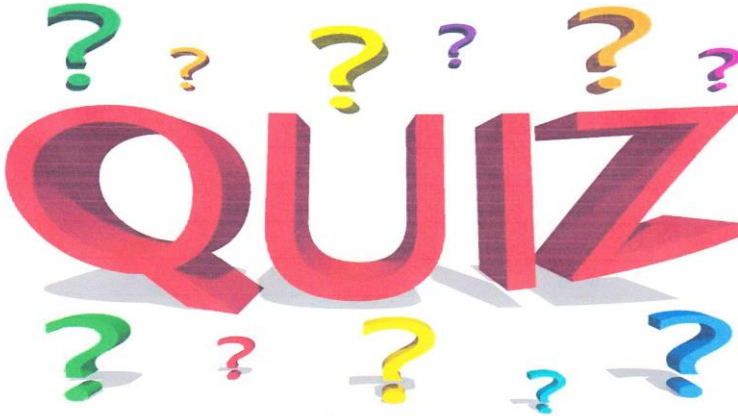
