When I became the lead minister and pastor of the church of St Andrew, Eastleach, a few years ago, I was asked to write a short piece in the CHEQS Magazine to introduce myself, so now I am saying, "Hello!" again!

I'm a licensed Lay Reader acting as a full-time vicar, being warmly welcomed by a simply wonderful church community in one of the loveliest villages in the Cotswolds - what more could anyone want?

Actually, I've been involved in the village since 1964, when I was the telephone maintenance man, for six telephone exchange areas, including Eastleach, as well as Southrop, Coln St Aldwyns, Bibury, Fairford, Fossebridge and North Cerney. I'm now retired, but kept busy by my family - four children and nine grandchildren, my very tolerant wife Kathryn, and our little dog Effie.

In the church, I run the services, leading most of them, deciding what sort of service we'll have, selecting the Bible readings, and working with the Parochial Church Council in looking after the building. And, most importantly, looking for ways to reach out and grow the family of God in this place.

Talking of which, I was chatting to someone at Jazz Club the other night, and the subject of Spring and Easter came up, with the fact that the date of Easter changed each year. Why? Christmas doesn't change, it's always 25th December, but Easter seems to change all the time, to dates between 22nd March (at the earliest) and 25th April (at the latest). I took the chance to explain, as well as I could, that the date of Easter changes because it's connected to the dates when Jesus was crucified (what we call Good Friday) and rose again from the dead (what we celebrate as Easter Day). The date changes because it is linked to the date of the Jewish feast of the Passover (*Pesach*), which is determined by the cycle of the moon. My friend was surprised at the reasons... and was equally amazed to hear that Easter is actually connected to Jesus!

If you're amazed too, why not drop in to your local church at Easter (which, this year, is on 17th April) and find out more - you'll be very welcome!

HELEN & SAM WADE, EASTLEACH DOWNS ORGANIC FARM

We arrived at Eastleach Downs 30 years ago this year, starting our own business as contract farmers of a 600-sow breeding herd. We are first generation tenant farmers

who met working for a pig breeding company in 1989. Back then, we worked on farms where pigs were kept on concrete (and at times were tethered – which is thankfully now banned in the UK), something that haunts us still, and was the motivation for the high welfare farm we run today. It's a sad fact that even today, fewer than 2% of pigs spend their entire lives outside.

When we started, half the farm was organic, and was owned Sir Thomas Bazley - a man ahead of his time. In 2000, we took on the rest of the farm and converted it all to organic. The farm was bought by the Ernest Cook Trust, along with the rest of the Hatherop Estate in 2002.





We bought our own herd after a few years, at the rate of three sows a week and started to rear pigs that spent their whole lives on the farm here. Today, we have a herd of 50 organic native rarebreed British Saddleback sows who are outside all year round. We are certified organic by the Soil Association and assured by RSPCA Freedom Foods. We joined a Higher Level Stewardship


scheme in 2013, and we have land in various schemes to support farmland birds. We also have some land identified as possible Bronze-Age burial sites and these have been sown with wildflowers and left uncultivated.

Traditionally, we have produced oats for organic porridge and barley for organic beer on our stony soil. Latterly, we have been looking at how sustainable our farm is and how we can work to reduce imported proteins (mainly soya) in our pig feed. We pioneered feeding homegrown silage to our pigs over ten years ago, something we were



told would never work and we still feed it today, getting through 150 big bales of silage a year. Last year, we grew dual crops: peas and barley; and wheat and beans. Together they have made a wonderful feed which our pigs actually prefer to the mass-produced bought-in organic feed that we have always used.

We started our own butchery in 2003, and we run a monthly box scheme in which we make all our own sausages and bacon, and provide pork for the best Sunday lunches at the Victoria Inn. I recently took delivery of my second bacon slicer. The first one having been a 40th birthday present 18 years ago!





always pretty busy - but especially when silage-making, harvesting etc. We have gone from contracting out our arable cropping to being self-sufficient, and even doing some contract farming for a neighbour. The learning curve has been a steep one at times, having no experienced farming parents to advise us – we have relied on friends, and peering over hedges…!



Seeing a crop through, from planting it ourselves, tending it (weeding) and finally harvesting it when it's ready, is something we never thought we'd be doing. We've become involved in innovative farmer-led research and we featured in the recent 'Rooting for Real Farms' series by Farms Not Factories, which promotes high welfare pig farming.

We are now in our sixth house as tenants and on our second landlord! We started renting one field on a grazing licence and now rent 320 acres on a farm business tenancy. We are fortunate enough to have great neighbours, who are very supportive of the way we farm. Our two daughters were brought up in Eastleach and are sensible enough not to want to farm...! They both went to university and we have them to thank for educating us in issues of equality and diversity.

We feel very privileged to be custodians of such a beautiful farm, and fortunate to have a job we enjoy every day. We recognise that there is a huge imbalance in access to land, and we are committed to doing our bit to change things. Those of us privileged to live and work in such a calm and peaceful space have a responsibility to not only share it, but to ensure that everyone feels welcome here. We have big plans for later on this year...


