

FROM THE VICAR OF COLN, HATHEROP & QUENINGTON

You'll have noticed that this copy of the *CHEQS* magazine is a two-month summer edition. Many thanks to all who got our late-summer news in promptly for it!

The truth is that the magazine is struggling to pay its way at the moment. We are proud to deliver a copy free to every home in our five villages, and you tell us that it provides an invaluable community service. It's funded by our advertisers, and by the generous sponsorship of Hatherop Castle School .. but costs have been creeping up while our income has remained static.

As a short-term measure the churches are stepping in to bridge the gap – this edition is funded by Coln, Hatherop & Quenington church council – but we need urgently either to cut costs or raise income, or both. This two-month summer edition is a small step towards saving a little money.

In terms of income, more advertising would be a simple step to breaking even, and we'd like to find someone who can organise this for us. The practical task of liaising with our existing advertisers, collecting the money etc, is already looked after: might you volunteer to go out and recruit some more businesses to advertise in our pages? You'd have the satisfaction of helping a very worthwhile local asset. Please let us know.

In terms of costs, we're looking at various options. Now that our five churches are run as less of a unit (Southrop & Eastleach relating increasingly to Lechlade, and Coln, Hatherop & Quenington due to have closer links for a while at least with Bibury), less of the magazine is relevant across all five villages, and the task of compiling information (especially different church services, hymns & readings) is more complex and prone to error. So one possibility would be to provide separately for the eastern & western halves of CHEQS – with CHQ in particular benefiting from an economy of editing with our website, making the task much more efficient, especially after my retirement this autumn.

With the changes of staff this year we have been reviewing the vision of our school. All members of our school community have had the opportunity to contribute their ideas: governors, teachers, parents and children. Fittingly our value this term is Friendship.

Our Year 5 and 6 will have great opportunities to make new friends on our residential visit to a chateau near St Omer in France, which we will be taking along with pupils from Hatherop, Bibury and North Cerney schools. Amongst the trips we will be visiting Le Touquet market, the Menin Gate in Ypres, a boulangerie to make croissants and a chocolate factory. While the older children are away the rest of the school enjoy an enrichment week which this time will celebrate the book character Elmer the elephant, who is 30 years old this year. There will be opportunities to talk about diversity, sustainability, recycling, symmetry... and much more.

The last term of the year is always an exciting time, with sports day, district sports, trips, a sculpture show in our wildlife garden, inspired by the FreshAir show amongst other things. It is also a time to look back on the year and reflect. Each child writes a letter to themselves relating the highs and lows of their year; these letters are stored in a treasure box and given to the children when they leave the school. At the end of term we will giving these to our seven Year 6s and wishing them well as they prepare to move on to their next school.
