

Hello from... Steve Clarke

Eight years ago, my partner Vince and I were living near Burford, but although we loved the area, the estate didn't have any real community spirit. An internet search found a house available in Eastleach, a village we'd never seen or even heard of before. One snowy Sunday, we found the village, and fell in love. Unfortunately, the property had already been snapped up, but the estate agent suggested number 29 - and although it needed a lot work and love, we've created a real home for ourselves.

I work from home for an oil company as a marketing manager. Vince worked for 27 years at John Lewis as IT Manager for their distribution centres, but has now retired following a stroke and heart attack three years ago. It was at this difficult time that we realised how lucky we were to live in Eastleach, as our friends and neighbours really did give us amazing support.

Vince is a keen gardener, developing from scratch an amazing oasis of colour, with palms and bananas mingling with roses and magnolias! He even finds time to help friends and neighbours with their plots.

We've always tried to get involved with the community, running the tombola at the fête for four years, and the bar at the village hall and community events.

I built and manage the village website, <u>www.eastleach.org</u> which has proved very popular with locals, as well as people planning a visit to Eastleach. It attracts around 5,000 visitors a month, so I'm hoping to be able to place adverts for local businesses with profits going to village hall funds.

Vince & I got married at Christmas 2019 in Mexico, and had been planning a party in the village, to celebrate and thank our friends - but COVID-19 put paid to that.

During lockdown we kept busy by bringing the old donkey paddock in the centre of the village back to life. Chickens, ducks, and the goats Freeman, Hardy & Willis have all settled in. We also keep rescued ex-battery hens on part of the allotments, and are happy to keep our neighbours supplied with their free-range eggs.

With schools understandably reluctant to invite in any extra supporters, I have been taking Collective Worship sessions via online Zoom meetings or prerecording a message in advance for a school. I have just been given permission to recommence the important role of mentoring at the secondary school, and already demand is exceeding the available space allocation! In addition, it has been a key

time to support students going away from us to a confusing and uncertain start to life in new surroundings.

Clearly there have been limitations in running evening youth clubs but our Tuesday evening Quench discussion group has been able to thrive despite the restrictions.

In this age of increased technology, it seems that young people still crave close face-to-face relations, and social activities are greatly missed. Through all this uncertainty we continue to encourage young people to consider our unchanging God and ask for your prayers as they navigate their way through the uncertainty that has torn away many established foundations.

Remembrance honours those who serve to defend our democratic freedoms and way of life. 
HIDDEN BUSINESSES

... Albee Yeend



I started making silver jewellery over 10 years ago, and what began purely as a hobby has now turned into a business. Whilst wearing one of my starfish necklaces, I was asked to make one for a friend - my first commission - and so began Albee Jewellery. My workbench is tucked under the stairs in my kitchen, and it's definitely the messy corner of the room!

Having worked in travel (organising holidays to Africa) I enjoyed beachcombing in South Africa, especially in Plettenberg Bay. I was inspired by the natural items I found, particularly the starfish, which are my most popular pieces. Other objects I've made are seed pods, shells - including the amazing Pansy shell - wishbones, tusks, poppy seed heads, acorns, hearts, and stars.





During lockdown, I started taking daily photos of flowers in my garden and the wildlife in the area. Having tried unsuccessfully to photograph my jewellery indoors, I decided to place the jewellery in the context of my garden, which made a really good combination - the colourful flowers really made the silver stand out. As well as making jewellery, I love being creative in other ways, and have started making cards, using photos of flowers and wildlife.

2020 has certainly been 'interesting', but lockdown allowed me time to progress with photography and to be more creative with my jewellery. Having worked so far purely with sterling silver and various gem-stones, I am now planning to branch out into gold, so I have plenty of challenges ahead.


