

INTO THE FUTURE

Now that John Partington has moved on, (or will have done by the time we reach October) our thoughts turn to the next few months in our parish – the western three villages of the CHEQS area.

The Church of England has a policy of leaving at least a short gap between vicars, for practical reasons (*eg* allowing time for one vicar to move out of the house and the next to move in) and also more generally so that parishes can take responsibility for their own affairs, and benefit for a while from being part of the wider church. In our case the gap between clergy is likely to be relatively short – see details on page 2.

As a parish we're blessed by being part of a large and supportive benefice (the 'South Cotswolds Team Ministry'), as well of the wider Deanery & Diocese, and we shall be taking full advantage of that.

On October 6th our archdeacon **Phil Andrew** will be presiding & preaching at the 11.00 am service in Coln. (We benefited, you may remember, from an excellent Good Friday meditation that he led a little while ago.)

At All Saintside our annual In Memoriam service (6.00 pm on November 3rd in Quenington) is being led by our Team Rector, **John Swanton**. If you'd like anyone remembered by name at that, please contact any of the churchwardens.

The following week, November 10th, our Remembrance Sunday service (10.45 am in Hatherop) is being led by our former vicar **Tony Ross**. Tony still lives locally and is a good friend of many.

And week by week our neighbouring vicar (of Bibury etc), **Tim Hastie-Smith**, will be keeping an eye on things in our three villages. Tim is an internationally experienced clergyman, and we are very fortunate to be able to benefit from his many gifts in this way.

A part of a wider reorganisation in the Team, the post is becoming part-time (and unpaid), with the new Vicar looking after just the three-church parish – rather than the six churches that John used to care for. This should in practice work to our advantage, as she or he will be able to focus more fully on this particular part of the team.

Because John gave unusually good notice of his retirement, the Diocese have been able to move more quickly than usual, and the post is already being advertised. We know that at least one well-qualified person is showing an interest, and we have good hopes of the post being filled before long. We shall of course keep you up to date as we are able.

FRESH AIR SCULPTURE 2019

Dear Friends and Neighbours,

I write on behalf of the trustees and the curators to thank you for the support you have given us for the 2019 show.

As you may have guessed from the number of cars in the village we had about 10,000 visitors to Fresh Air. We sold 128 pieces of sculpture in the 3 weeks. The Pool House Gallery looked beautiful and had a brisk turnover of sales as did Robert’s plant stall.

This helps us fund our education programme, but we could not have managed without the support of the Childwick Trust, the Ernest Cook Trust, The Coln

Fete Committee and the Quenington Bulldogs. This year involved just over 800 children and young people from local schools and colleges, spanning infant to A-level as well as Special Needs. Members of the education team worked alongside teachers using the exhibition to explore ways of looking at art – a subject now largely excluded from the national curriculum. Hereford College is a remarkable exception and the Netherton Prize, kindly donated by Bill Davis, recognised this. This year, as part of a new joint venture, Bath Spa University sponsored the two excellent assistant curators, Lauren Cattle and Maia Walton.

Without the help of a huge range of volunteers the Fresh Air Sculpture Show would not have given our visitors an experience that many have written about – to us and in social media. As usual, we had visits from art therapy groups such as The Churn Project, The Nelson Trust, Art Lift and Aphasia Now. A particular feature of 2019 was the increased number of interested groups booking tours, such as Friends of Art Galleries; and the Cirencester Art Society had a private evening visit.

The Fringe expanded into the Village Hall for painting and photography exhibitions but also a pop-up restaurant. The sculpture in the churchyard was hugely popular, mounted by the Ernest Cook Trust, with the addition of work from Hatherop primary and Castle schools. The vicar made £700 for church funds through his book sales in the pews.

As the result of this we have given bursaries for art-orientated projects to the youth groups who helped with the parking (the bugbear of the show); and to Hatherop Primary School and the Parish Council.

Our thanks to our neighbouring farmers who broke off from a busy harvest to help with installation of large pieces. Our main thanks however, go to all in Quenington who put up with the 3 weeks of inconvenience.

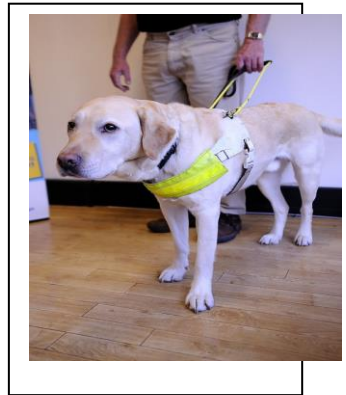
