#### SOUTHROP COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

The last few months have confirmed that most of the drivers coming through our village clearly think that our 20mph speed restriction does not apply to them. After the Air Tattoo on the Sunday afternoon in ¾ hour only, we recorded over 50 vehicles travelling between 30 and 40mph through the village, of which many were Range Rovers. Earlier in the month, during one hour in one afternoon we recorded three vehicles travelling at between 40 and 45mph, the rough equivalent of 135-150mph on a Motorway, which would attract six points on a licence and a fine! #### FOUND- THE LOST HEROES OF EASTLEACH.

Following the publishing of the Lost heroes of Eastleach story a few months ago, I was put in touch with a Lavender Feltham who is to celebrate her 90th birthday next year and still has a very clear memory of that fateful day. On seeing the crash from a distance the 11yr old Lavender cycled to the crash site which was inside the gateway just before the cottages on the Eastleach farmhouse access road. On arrival she found her brother Albert Russell along

with Nobby Clark from one of the cottages, had using an axe chopped into the rear gun turret of the plane and carried the injured Pilot to safety.

Lavender found him propped up against a tree, she claims it's still there and can take me to it!

The five who died were amongst the 5,327 RAF bomber command airmen who were killed in training during the WW2.

This investigation with the help of a number of local people may help to keep the memory of the sacrifice of those brave young men alive.
