Hello from... Abby Hookey & Luke de Marco



Locals may have spotted some different sheep appearing on the glebe land and paddocks in Coln St Aldwyns. These are our flock of native Hebridean sheep, chosen for their conservation grazing skills. Luke was brought up on a small farm and currently balances aviation consultancy with contract farming. I'm not from a farming background, but food and animals have always been a great love of mine and resulted in me completing a master's degree at the Royal Agricultural University, whilst also working as an NHS dietitian. When we came to the area, we lived for a short while in Coln, and then moved to Quenington, where we were for over two years. It was while we were there that we put in a bid for the land. It was 18 months before we heard! We had assumed we hadn't got it, and moved to a smallholding in Miserden. However, as we don't have enough room for sheep there, we jumped at the opportunity to rent the land in Coln when it was offered to us. We're aware that people aren't used to animals being on this land, so please be careful to: a) keep the gates shut - Hebridean sheep are a very shy breed and their Houdini skills are quite something, so we don't want them popping up in people's gardens! b) keep dogs on a lead and c) clean up after them, as dog mess is very toxic to livestock. Thanks!

Luke and I are passionate about regenerative farming: protecting land from overgrazing, promoting biodiversity, and using organic principles. We use electric fencing to adopt the 'mob grazing' or 'strip grazing' principle, which aims to mimic natural grazing instinct. We move the stock regularly around the fields, so they fertilise it naturally, and it allows the land to regenerate - with the added bonus of low worm counts, so no need to worm the sheep! The flock are 100% pasture fed, resulting in quality meat with higher nutritional value, as well as being environmentally beneficial compared to their grain-fed counterparts. Having our own flock based on these values is really important to us and we're very excited to have been given this opportunity. We're hoping to grow our flock during lambing in March/April - the ram has recently gone in, so fingers crossed...!

Hebridean wool is known to make a great pair of socks, so if there are any spinners out there, please get in touch. And if you see us in the fields, do come and say hello!



TOGETHER, LET'S PLANT BRITAIN... AND HATHEROP!

Judy Francis writes: I'm sure everyone is aware of BBC Countryfile's 'Plant Britain' project (which has a two-year goal of planting 750,000 trees - one for every child who started primary school in 2020), and The Woodland Trust's 'Big Climate Fightback' which plans to plant 50 million trees across the UK. Well, Hatherop has made its own contribution to this, by planting 8 fruit trees at the allotments.

Tree planting is a climate change solution that is available here and now, is the cheapest and easiest one possible, and one that every one of us can get involved in. On a Sunday afternoon in November, a band of 20 villagers armed with spades, forks and pick-axes,



descended on the allotments, cheered on by a band of well-wishers. They started digging holes to create our own Community Orchard.



The trees were sourced from Batsford Arboretum Garden Centre, where the staff couldn't have been more helpful. We are very grateful to both Hatherop Parish Council and the Ernest Cook Trust for their support and funding, including ECT giving permission to use one of the allotments for the Orchard.

So, it may be a drop in the ocean, but an ocean is made up of drops - and Hatherop has now done its own little bit in the battle against climate change. We also hope to be enjoying harvesting the apples, pears, cherries, and plums for many years to come.

Thanks to everyone who turned up for what was a very enjoyable afternoon in glorious autumn sunshine. If you are passing nearby, do stop and admire the Community Orchard - it looks wonderful!
