



We (myself, my husband Jim, and eight rescue dogs) have lived at Netherton Lodge, Quenington, for three years. Some of you will have been greeted by the dogs as you walk past! We're very grateful to you for being so tolerant of their idiosyncrasies. We have a daughter, Cecily, who lives in London with her husband, baby, and rescue dog - who you may also have heard when she visits.

I lived in Paris, New York, Tokyo and London before moving to Gloucestershire thirteen years ago, always with a selection of dogs beside me. My first rescue was a stray I found by the side of the road in New York. I scooped him up and he became my loyal companion.



Once back in England, I became involved with Dogs Trust, whose work of rehoming dogs is quite well-known. There are 22 centres, with Evesham, Newbury and Salisbury being the closest - at the moment, the Evesham centre is looking for foster homes for dogs who struggle in a kennel environment. I'm so proud of being involved with such a fantastic organisation, and am thrilled to be able to tell you about some of their lesser-known activities: the **Hope Project** helps


homeless people with veterinary care for their animals, and works with shelter organisations to make them pet friendly; the **Freedom Project** finds temporary foster homes for dogs whose owners are fleeing domestic violence - sadly needed in much greater numbers since the lockdowns; in addition, there are education programmes in schools and prisons, as well as courses for the Post Office!

We also give grants and advice to smaller organisations, including veterinary training courses in India, Thailand and Bosnia. We are particularly proud of our work funding the vaccination of dogs against rabies, starting in Goa in 2014, which has resulted in the Government of Goa declaring the state to be "rabies controlled" with not a single case of rabies in humans since 2018. This work continues to expand into other parts of the world.

As my family knows, I could go on and on... but do look up <u>dogstrust.org.uk</u> to find out more, and I look forward to meeting you out and about, perhaps walking dogs.

COTSWOLD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Business grants - Omicron financial support grants

Just before Christmas, the Government announced two additional business grants that Local Authorities will be administering: the Omicron Hospitality and Leisure Grant and a new round of Additional Restrictions Grants (ARG).



Cotswold District Council is working to set up the processes to get these grants out to support eligible businesses, and aims to keep all businesses updated via their Business Matters newsletter, their website, and through social

media. Please check, if you think your business might be eligible for help.

The Omicron Hospitality and Leisure Grant will support hospitality, leisure and accommodation business premises. The Government have set out the eligibility criteria for this grant. CDC aims to have emailed all those businesses which previously received a grant from them, and those believed to be eligible, by the end of January. An application form on their website will be available at the end of January for any new applicants.

For the ARG funding, CDC received limited amounts of money from the Government to distribute to businesses which have been severely impacted by the recent surge in cases but not covered by the other grant. An application form for this grant, with a list of eligible businesses and criteria, should be available on the website towards the middle of February.

SOUTHROP VILLAGE POST OFFICE

Sadly, for the second time, the 40th Anniversary celebration for Southrop Village Shop was postponed due to Covid precautions, but last month another special event did manage to take place. The Post Office's Shelagh Benfield was presented with a voucher as a token of thanks from the community for 21 years of service in the weekly Post Office in Southrop Village Hall. Shelagh was new to the village when she took the job on, and saw it as a good way to get to know people locally.

At the end of last year, the Post Office also gave Shelagh some recognition of her good work, awarding her with a hamper for the most Special Deliveries by a small Post Office in the area.

TIM MORRIS, CONEYGAR FARM, QUENINGTON

If you are used to driving out of Quenington up Coneygar Road you will already know our farm, which is on both sides of the lane for nearly two miles. Similarly, if you take the footpath up the Coln

valley from Coln St Aldwyns towards Bibury with the river on your right, that is our

northern boundary. The Morris family has farmed here for more than sixty years. My parents, Tony & Betty Morris, first took tenancy of the farm in 1959 - it was then part of the Williamstrip Estate. Julia & I have taken over in more recent years and our sons, Dominic and Oliver, are both active on the farm too. We consider ourselves immensely privileged to live and work in such beautiful surroundings.

Like all farmers, our lives are ruled by the seasons and by the weather, a strangely comforting situation since one can do nothing about either. Not so welcome sometimes are

the host of other factors which affect us: markets, currencies, climate change, fertiliser and fuel prices and, most of all, government regulations.

Over the years, we have simplified our enterprises and mixed farming has gradually given way to specialist cereal production - wheat, barley and oats. Today we find ourselves in the midst of one of the biggest upheavals in farming since the 2nd World War and, after years of being encouraged to produce food, we are now being advised to diversify into other sources of income, as subsidies are gradually removed and agriculture is de-intensified - and more of the nation's food will have to be imported.







Emphasis is now on improving the environment, particularly by raising the organic content of our soils i.e. carbon capture. For arable farmers, this means a change in our cultivations policy, with a marked reduction in ploughing (since this is seen as harmful to the environment) and an increase in direct drilling - the practice of placing the seed into an undisturbed soil surface (alongside debris from the previous crop). 'Green is good, brown is bad' has become the mantra and observant passers-by may already have noticed a marked reduction in the number of fields which are left brown over winter. Some may also have noticed the distinct absence of the yellow oilseed rape crops up Coneygar Road in the last three years. This is following the ban on the use of

neonicotinoid seed dressings and the loss in 2019 of over 100 acres of our rape crop due to Cabbage Stem Flea Beetle - and our subsequent abandonment of the crop.

The latest issue to occupy our minds is the trebling in the price of fertilisers for this coming year, and we are looking into ways of reducing our reliance on this finite resource, whilst at the same time minimising the inevitable reduction in crop yields.

Finally, having celebrated a milestone birthday recently, it will soon be time for me to take a step back in the running of the farm. Somewhat unexpectedly, my retirement will coincide with what many see as the end of an era in British agriculture. Who knows what the next chapter will hold?


