Editor: This month's Hello From... is written by a Lechlade resident, rather than someone who lives in one of the CHEQS villages. However, lain may have contact with people throughout our area, and has an interesting story to tell of his involvement with the Community Friends.



My wife and I live in Lechlade, having moved here as a result of her job back in 2011. We've been together for 32 years (married for 28) since we met on the Isle of Wight at a country music festival, just after I'd left the Royal Navy following ten years of service. My wife says that volunteering is my full-time job as, for the last 12 years, I've been supporting Wiltshire Search & Rescue and South West Ambulance Trust, as a Community First Responder. Latterly, I've been supporting the Friends of Fairford & Lechlade Communities (which used to be called the Fairford Hospital League of Friends, and is now shortened to Community Friends!). This year, I was awarded the Platinum Jubilee Medal for Voluntary Service, and consider it a privilege to be able to help where I can.

I'm not the most gregarious of people and, having moved around so much with my wife's career and being a forces veteran, I was finding it hard to settle down and had become withdrawn. This was exacerbated when, in early 2015, our dog Max, passed away leaving a big hole in my life. Just after this event, I saw the League of Friends' advert seeking drivers and, as I enjoy driving and wanted to get involved with the local community, I felt that this could be an ideal match. Driving for the charity has enabled me to make new friends, and stopped me from becoming isolated and further withdrawn from society. Over the years, I've met many wonderful people and enjoyed many a diverse conversation, particularly on the longer drives. I have come to realise that I am helping others in the same way that the Community Friends has helped me, as I am one of the few visitors some of my clients have on a regular basis.

On average I spend around 20 hours a week volunteering for the Community Friends, having completed well over 1000 drives in the seven years that I have been doing the role. I've also supported door-to door-collections, sold cards, and have taken on the role of driver coordinator when required.

When not volunteering, I enjoy walking our rescue dog, Ellie, as well as decorating, gardening, woodworking, cross stitch, listening to a variety of music and making novelty cakes for friends & family.





REMEMBERING RALPH VAUGHAN WILLIAMS

Ray Michael writes: This month marks the 150th anniversary of the birth of Ralph Vaughan Williams. The son of a Welsh clergyman, he was born in Down Ampney, and went on to become one of Britain's greatest composers. His father died when he was 3 years old, and his family went to live at Leith Hill in Surrey.

The music of Vaughan Williams embodies the quintessential qualities of the English countryside. He wrote nine great symphonies, and is also well-known for pieces such as *The Lark Ascending*, the *Fantasia on Greensleeves*, and the *Fantasia*

on a Theme by Thomas Tallis. He became a dedicated collector of English folk music, and his later works were heavily influenced by those tunes, including *Five Variants* of *Dives and Lazarus*, and the *English Folk Song Suite*. He also edited the English Hymnal for two years between 1904 and 1906 and wrote much church music.

Coln Choir is helping to celebrate the life of RVW by singing at a special commemorative service in *Quenington Church on 16th October at 10.30am*. The hymns and anthems will feature his music, and we would be pleased to welcome everyone to join us for this very special musical occasion for lovers of English music!

THE ERNEST COOK TRUST

Jo Smyth writes: If you're out and about in the CHEQS countryside, then you may have come across Steve Jones. He's the Estate Ranger for The Ernest Cook Trust's 'Fairford and home estates', covering around 9,000 acres.

Steve moved to Fairford in 1975 when his dad, David, began working for the lles family, first at Park Farm and then at Leafield Farm. Other than some years spent farming near Thornbury, Steve has lived and worked in the area ever since.

"I'd had an interest in wildlife and the countryside from an early age, and when I left school, I trained as a gamekeeper through a YTS scheme, on land owned by The Ernest Cook Trust, with gamekeeper Reg Allen," says Steve.

Steve went on to work for David Phillips, at Farhill Farm (the farm is now run by his son, John). Steve then studied at agricultural college before going into farming himself. On returning to Fairford, Steve again worked for David, as gamekeeper, before joining The Ernest Cook Trust in 2018.

"Coming back to Fairford gave me an opportunity to put my love of conservation into practice," said Steve. "Seeing the difference in the land from when I had was brought up in Fairford to how it was when I returned was noticeable. We'd lost so much of the habitat and wildlife population."

As Estate Ranger, Steve's tasks are many and varied, but at the heart is conservation, and educating people about the countryside. On a daily basis, Steve will be managing habitats, putting up birdboxes, or trying to improve the diversity of 250 acres of woodland. "Some of what we do involves taking trees out, because that gives two or three trees the chance to grow where one stood. Sadly, we also have to remove trees due to ash dieback - but we are also replanting, where appropriate."

Deer and vermin management falls to Steve, as well as repairing fencing, clearing litter and dumped rubbish, and keeping an eye out for poachers. Feeding the wild bird population over winter and spring helps keep a healthy population. This year, a



highlight for Steve has been to see lapwings successfully fledge. The team will soon be starting a new programme of conservation work across the Trust's three-mile catchment of the River Coln (from Fairford to North Quenington). Working with other local groups, this will be a significant investment in the environmental potential of this wonderful natural resource.

THE SECRET OF FIELD NAMES – MILTON FARM

Heather Paterson, of Quenington, writes: When I was ten years old, we moved to Milton Farm, in Fairford, and I remember being fascinated by the large map that hung on the wall in my father's office, showing the outline of


every field on the farm. Each year it would be overlaid with his plan for crop rotation with different cross-hatching indicating what would be cultivated; wheat, barley, potatoes, maize, oil seed rape or permanent pasture.

But that was not what fascinated me; it was that every field was named. It made sense of course - why try to explain to the tractor man, "Go and drill the first field on the left up the Bibury track" when you could simply say, "Pete, this morning you're in Shamingo."



The names ranged from the descriptive, *Cherry Copse*, *Windmill* and *Badger's Bank*, to the more prosaic, *Near Common* and *Pitham North*, and the downright unimaginative, *Forty Acres*. Some seemed to hark back to long-forgotten previous ownership, *Leonard's Bush*, *Price's*, *Arnold's Field* and *Gassons* for instance, but there were some which demanded further investigation. Why, in the midst of the rolling Cotswold countryside, was there an area bounded by hedges known as *Iris Lands*? Were acres of cut flowers once grown there? It seemed unlikely. The answer, it turned out, lay in the archives left by the previous tenants of Milton Farm, Ted Geach and his father, Nick. The map on Dad's wall had earlier iterations which

showed the same field, fifty years earlier, marked as *Irish Lands* and fifty years before that as *High Ridge Lands*, so the name had changed over generations of indistinct speech, poor hearing, inaccurate copying - or a combination of all three!



There are still mysteries to be solved to trace the etymology of field names like *Pincham Piece*, *Shamingo*, *Hangmans*, *Big Vernal*, *Hemplands*, *Picket Piece* and *Pennyfield*, so if anyone has any ideas, please let me know.

The map was also scattered with clues to previous guardians of the land; *Mustoe's Plantation* is named after Mr Mustoe, who farmed Court Farm in Quenington in the 1950s and 60s; *Paton's Copse*, planted some years later, refers to my father, tenant at Milton Farm from 1969 to 2002, and *Tom's Copse* remembers the irascible Tom Rymer, who farmed at Waiten Hill Farm for many years, before his son, Richard, took over in the 1970's.



A version of the map can still be seen on the wall of the office at Milton Farm, and now my brother Tom is leaving traces of his own family's tenure of the land, with three fields named after his children, Callum's, Jessie's - and Megan's (shown here).

Added to these, the small field closest Quenington (previously, the somewhat workaday Quenington 12) is now Fiona's, named after my sister who, bored and frustrated by lockdown. was set the task of walking the perimeter of all sixty fields on the farm (over 40 miles in all) to mark her approaching 60th birthday. Ever keen to rise to a challenge, she completed the somewhat muddy undertaking

November 2020, finishing in her favourite place, the river meadow, where her admiring nephews and nieces walked the final field with her, and enjoyed a socially distanced glass of bubbly on Moss Bridge to celebrate her achievement!

I love how that old map still has a story to tell.


