

Hello from... Neal Cotton



I'm one of the worship leaders from St Lawrence Church, Lechlade, who help out at Eastleach & Southrop churches. I've been helping Gordon Land with the Morning Prayer services at Eastleach, normally for one Sunday each month.

I was born in Surrey, and studied in Manchester where I met Sue. We celebrated our Golden Wedding anniversary earlier this year. We've moved around the country as I've changed jobs. I've always worked in the food industry in a technical role: with dairy products including ice cream, and wheat flour and all its products – finishing with 30 years in the biscuit industry. I had 12 years with Jacob's Cream Crackers in Liverpool, a couple of years in Genoa, 3 years back in Liverpool and, finally, 12 years based in the company's technical centre to the south west of Paris. Latterly, my role was to develop new biscuit varieties produced in factories across Europe. This has all meant lots of time spent in airports, hotels and factories, from Portugal to Moscow.

When I retired, seven years ago, we wanted to move back to the UK because we have four daughters and ten grandchildren, who are spread between Cheshire, Surrey and Kent. We wanted somewhere which was accessible to all, but not TOO close! Thus, the Cotswolds seemed a perfect choice. After a lot of searching and numerous visits, we settled on Lechlade. It has shops, doctors, dentist and vets – the latter being important as we have had golden retrievers for the past 47 years. We currently have a seven-year-old and an 18-month delinquent!

I had no involvement with the church growing up, and it was only when our first daughter was born that I joined my wife as she went to church on a Sunday morning. I was confirmed a couple of years later, just before our second daughter was born. Since that time, I have been actively involved in a number of churches, as church warden, worship leader and what seems like countless years on PCCs.

In my retirement, I am now chair of the Lechlade Gardening Club, a trustee of the Lechlade Memorial Hall, and active with Faringdon U3A, as well as the church in Lechlade. Combining these activities with our two dogs and a motorhome, plus visiting (or being visited by) our daughters and families keeps us pretty busy.

Life has been enriched by the involvement with the community in Eastleach and it has been a real pleasure to lead the worship there.

SWAP YOUR OLD STAMPS FOR NEW, BEFORE 31ST JANUARY



Royal Mail are adding barcodes to their regular stamps. After 31st January, regular stamps without a barcode will no longer be valid (although special stamps with pictures on and Christmas stamps without a barcode will continue to be valid and don't need to be swapped). The stamps that are changing are those (pictured left) that feature the profile of Her Late Majesty the Queen on a plain




VILLAGE HALLS WEEK - END OF JANUARY

BOOK CLUBS

There are various book clubs (sometimes known as 'reading groups') running in our villages, but you may not know about them, because, by and large, local book clubs tend to be membership by invitation only. The groups often meet in the homes of members, and

numbers have to be limited to enable everyone to participate fully.

So, what do they get up to? Usually, meetings are monthly, so that people have time to read the book being discussed. It could be a daytime or an evening group, meeting for about two hours or so. They usually involve drinks and snacks of some sort – wine or tea/coffee, depending on the time of day and the people involved!



Discussion may revolve around the plot, the style of writing, the characterisation, any particularly stand-out sections or plot twists, what was liked or disliked...



A good book club will be welcoming and friendly, with lots of listening as well as talking, and having a variety of styles of book to read and talk about. If you are interested in belonging to a group, but don't know of any near you, perhaps consider asking a few friends if they would like to create one with you.

There are also online book clubs, and some TV and radio presenters run something similar. You may find that our local libraries have a book club – pop in and find out.

Whichever sort of book club/reading group you join, you will probably meet new people, have your type of reading broadened, be able to share your favourite books, experience new ideas and thoughts, and above all, gain more pleasure from reading.

Unwanted bras are being collected by Aldsworth resident, Jayne Costley, to support the Abingdon-based charity, *Against Breast Cancer*. Once she has collected 200, Jayne takes the bras to Abingdon. The charity's bra recycling scheme raises vital funds for pioneering breast cancer research. The bras also help small businesses in developing countries in Africa and around the world – they are given a new lease of life in countries such

as Togo, Ghana and Kenya, where bras remain expensive to produce locally. Successful ventures like this provide an income for families in developing countries whilst also providing some employment for people living in the UK. Any bras that are genuinely beyond redemption are dismantled and disposed of properly. For every tonne of bras collected, Against Breast Cancer receives £700 to fund their research. The Friends of Fairford and Lechlade Communities' Nursing Team (above) provides palliative care to patients in their homes. The team of registered nurses and healthcare assistants supports patients who wish to remain at home at the end of their lives. The Home Nursing service is available to patients of Fairford and Lechlade GP Surgeries. Working alongside the patient's GP and the district nurses, they care for the patient and support their families. Patients can be referred through the district nurse, who will contact the Nursing Managers, Emma Kennedy and Jan Killingback. Together they will make all the necessary arrangements. Members of the team are often local people themselves and are familiar to many in the community. The care they provide brings them close to people at a very difficult time, and their kindness is always appreciated by patients and their loved ones. This year, the nursing team launched the Bereavement Café, where those experiencing a loss can seek trained support and meet other people in a similar situation. The nursing service is provided to patients at no cost to themselves or their families, and is funded by the charity through donations and fundraising events. The daughter of one patient said, "It was like having family come to our house rather than strangers. They always checked my wellbeing too before they went to care for my mum.
