

News from last term:

Kingfisher Class went on a trip to the Corinium Museum in Cirencester. They learnt a lot about what Roman citizens' and gladiators' lives were like. The first workshop they attended involved activities such as dressing up, food sorting, mosaics, games and re-building pottery. They then went to the gladiator workshop, where they got to wear the helmets and hold the fake weapons. They even participated in some pretend Roman battles against each other! They had a great day at the museum and ended it off by looking around the Roman gallery.



Two artists came to the school to help everyone make some amazing art in a really unique way they assisted everyone to make some spin art. This involved using a tile, which gets spun very quickly, whilst paint is added in layers. The

results were amazing, and everyone had their own unique tile to display at the art exhibition after school. Parents and the local community were all invited to attend.





Harley writes: A Science Dome came into our school. It was a big black dome which took up more than half of the hall! We had to take our shoes off and crawl into a tunnel which led to the entrance. It was very funny watching the teachers' heads pop up out of the tunnel! When we got into the dome there were two men who were teaching us and said that the sound travelled

differently in there so we could hear everything. It was so cool! They taught us all about forces, friction and gravity and we made our own pop-rockets, which were bits

of liquid nitrogen (which was -90 degrees!) and we trapped it in a container until it expanded and popped up into the air - it made us all jump! They also made a light show which had stars and it looked amazing on the side of the black dome! It was really fun and a great experience, I learnt a lot!

In the Swan classroom the topic this term is the Tudors. We will be thinking about Henry VIII and Elizabeth and whether they were good monarchs. This topic involves lots of role-play and debate, which should be good preparation for the Year 5&6s, who are competing in the Mock Trial competition in Cheltenham in June. We will also be preparing and hosting a Tudor Banquet and entertainment.



The Cygnets are in for a treat with the topic Turrets and Tiaras which includes a study of castles and a visit to Sudeley Castle.


