

Hello from...
Tristan
Wilkinson

I agreed to write this article when I was standing for the Cotswold District Council so, having missed out being elected by 40 votes, it feels a little self-indulgent to be writing this... but a promise is a promise.

I moved to the area with Sarah in 2000 with a new born and a bump. We started off in Crudwell where we lived for a year, but after being flooded with 1.5m of water in our home we decided to move.

We were exploring schools and properties and came to look at the school in Hatherop. I still remember the first time I drove from Coln to Hatherop – wow, this is amazing, what a stunning place, Hatherop Castle on top of the hill, it looked like something from a film set. We ended up renting a cottage in the village where our second child was born, in Cheltenham Hospital to be exact. Our children went to school in Hatherop and then on to Cheltenham and Abingdon - great schools, but raking up about 40,000 miles a year in school runs was hard! After a five-year stint just outside the village we finally moved into our dream house in Hatherop in May 2006, only to be flooded two weeks later!

Since 1995 my work has been in the tech sector. In 2000 I started working for Tony Blair's strategy unit (hence the above photo!) to promote, believe it or not, the adoption of the internet in people's homes. This started me on a new course, one I've been on ever since.

The rate of technological change is breakneck and the issue of Digital Inclusion, or the inability of people to access the internet with confidence and safety, is a modern problem. With the growth of Artificial Intelligence, deep fake content, and genome sequencing, understanding how to navigate the modern world is an essential life skill. This led me to co-found the Digital Poverty Alliance, with a £1m donation from Currys.

I remain passionate about many things - technology, the built environment, climate change, social justice - but all of it remains rooted in my love of where we live.


