



I'm ex-BBC, and have a company called Citizen Films, which produces videos and photography for brands big and small. It can involve working on ad campaigns with Usain Bolt one month, and the British Library the next. It's true what they say, about the relentlessness of running your own business. Added to this, living in west London was beginning to lose its appeal. It's congested and polluted, and I needed fields and trees... the Cotswolds were calling. So, I squirrelled away savings, and a couple of years ago bought what may well be the tiniest cottage in Southrop.

Arriving in this beautiful historic village, that is so well looked after, fills me with joy. Unlike in our London street, people here actually wave and say hello! As an outsider I've found there is a community spirit and gentle humour here that's a real antidote to my London existence. It's wonderful to be involved locally, as part of the village hall committee, helping organise some of the monthly events such as Southrop movie night and the village hall barn dances. The local social life here is always busy.

My daughter Esme and I are now in a transitional stage, still spending most of our time in London while she finishes school, but in a couple of years that balance will shift, and I'll be able to base myself much more in the village.



To aid the gradual change to a gentler pace of life, I've started a second business called ARTI, selling original art by vintage and emerging artists online, and at popups and events. We'll be at The Country Brocante's autumn fair at Thyme this month, and at the Curated Store in Stow-on-the-Wold in November. Working with private buyers and interior designers, for me this feels like a great way of establishing more of a footing in the Cotswolds. Please remember to collect your seeds for the Seed Swap: packets need to be clearly marked with the name and collection date. You could also add any other useful growing tips. Some

easy vegetables include beans, peas, tomatoes and spinach. Remember: dry the seeds completely on the plants for most seeds, reduce cross-pollination by only growing one variety of each species and isolate by distance - no hybrids, please! Only save seeds from the healthiest 'true-to-type' plants. There is more information on the village hall website.





#### **CHEQS MAGAZINE**

Margaret Stranks, editor, writes: During the year, the small CHEQS Magazine Support Group has become smaller still. The group was set up in 2020 (yes, just before Covid hit!), when the magazine changed from being a church parish magazine to being a community magazine. The main purpose was to provide support and encouragement to the editor, and to be a system of checks and balances, to ensure that the magazine was being well-run. It used to consist of a representative from each of the villages, with the idea that they could pass on comments from their communities. However, that didn't really work – and people in the villages seem quite happy to pass on comments to the editor directly. The 'group' now consists of two people (one from Coln St Aldwyns, and one from Southrop) plus the editor, so that it can be lean and efficient! I am very grateful to them both – not least because Nick Brett (Coln) has now taken on responsibility for finding people for the Hello From... feature, and Jan Roberts (Southrop) has become the new magazine distribution organiser. This has helped to lighten my load, and enables me to focus my limited time on the main job of editing the magazine.

#### NEWS FROM THE ERNEST COOK TRUST

#### Blacksmithing course helps students forge outdoor careers

A blacksmithing course - organised jointly by UK educational charity The Ernest Cook Trust, and Fresh Air Sculpture, which runs the biennial sculpture show in Quenington – saw some fantastic work

produced by the students involved. The six students on the blacksmithing course are all being supported by The Ernest Cook Trust to work towards employability awards, so they can go on to find employment in practical, outdoor-based roles. Their tutors were all Artist Blacksmithing undergraduates at Hereford College of Arts, and running this course has also contributed to their final degree show. There is a longstanding association between the College and Fresh Air Sculpture. All the equipment – including six portable, coke-fired forges and six anvils – was transported from the College to The Ernest Cook Trust's Skills Workshop in Fairford, and set up in a purpose-built outside space.

"This is the first time we have ever run this type of course, and everyone was excited to take part," said Pete Tatham, one of The Ernest Cook Trust's Outdoor Learning Officers. "Two of our students in particular want to be metalworkers, so this was an ideal opportunity for them."

The students have been working with Pete in the Trust's Skills Workshop, using a range of materials to produce everything from picnic benches and birdboxes, to bughouses and shelters, as well as sculptures that double up as habitats. Students' work is exhibited in Quenington churchyard during

the sculpture show, as part of the Trust's ongoing association with Fresh Air Sculpture.

Curator of Education at Fresh Air Sculpture, Emily Bird, said the course was a great example of a three-way collaboration between The Ernest Cook Trust, the College, and Fresh Air Sculpture, which also runs outreach education programmes. She said: "At Fresh Air Sculpture, we are passionate about preserving rural crafts such as forging. We are committed to supporting the arts and giving everybody the opportunity to access this programme, particularly those students who struggle with mainstream education. To provide them with an opportunity to succeed in the arts is an important and precious one."

The Ernest Cook Trust is a UK-wide educational charity, which creates Outdoor Learning experiences for children, young people and their families, on its own estates and with partner estates across the country. 

#### THE TALE OF A TALL AND TALENTED MODERN-DAY WOMAN



Story & photo from Chris Roberts MBE: A new auto-fiction book is out and can be found on Amazon and in bookshops across the UK. The characters of this book are fictional, but the poignant story is based on the author's autobiographical reflections of her lifetime struggles with her own body image.

Angelina Pelova is just over 6'5" tall and has battled throughout her life with: other people's perception of her; her ability to shop for clothes that will fit her tall frame; dating the right size men; fighting off the attention of males who have a weird fetish about tall women; explaining to sports coaches that she is hopeless at sports despite her size; and coming to terms with her own body. She says that her book is not just about tall women, but that it could help women who are short, fat, thin or have any other feature that is not regarded as the norm.

Angelina, originally from Bulgaria, but now living in Fairford, has called her book *A Tall Woman of Many Talents*. In it, she explains how over the years she has developed her self-esteem and confidence, and she hopes that her story might be an inspiration to other women who feel depressed about how they look. "This is probably the first novel to address tall people's issues and insecurities, and their struggles to fit into a world built around the needs of much shorter people," explains Angelina.

Written with a good sense of humour, the book has been likened to the Bridget Jones for tall people, and touches on many modern-day issues such as body image, the role of social media, immigration, discrimination in society and the workplace,

romance and controlling relationships.

In real life, Angelina has been a blogger for nine years. *Not Another Tall Blog* focuses on tall people's issues and offers advice and information on wellbeing, body image strategies, parenting and fashion. She says: "Unless you have experienced being ridiculed for the way you look, or ignored because people are embarrassed by you, you can't possibly imagine how difficult it is to be accepted."

This novel, Angelina's first, was written after gaining confidence from having several of her short stories published. Knowing that her work was read and appreciated by other people gave her the spur to keep writing. When she's not writing, Angelina works at a Wiltshire holistic health clinic, as she is also a qualified Reiki therapist and practitioner.
