Hello from... Lucy Abel Smith



In 1973 I was reading things medieval at university, and I visited Quenington to see St Swithin's magnificent Norman doorways. Never would I have guessed then that

I would be their neighbour, living here for 40 years so far in the Old Rectory, my husband David's family home for nearly a century!

David and I met at a party; he liked my shoes. We were engaged and married three months later with just three days of honeymoon in France, as we were both working.

I was born in Glasgow, and brought up surrounded by my grandfather's collections. I also joined my father, from an early age, poking around antique shops. I still have my childhood collection. And it's that passion and memory that prompted me to ask exhibitors at our biennial Fresh Air sculpture show to donate a model or drawing for children under 18 to buy. No parental guidance allowed!

I had a splendid art teacher at primary school and my career has included working at the V & A, and in auction houses, and from the 1970s taking tours around Europe and the Balkans (www.realityandbeyond.co.uk). I have a house in Romania where, in 2013, I started the Transylvanian Book festival.

Fresh Air began in 1992, when Cirencester's Brewery Arts wanted to create an outreach exhibition in a garden. We thought it would be a one-off! It was sculpture, pots, furniture, glass, no tents, and no admission charge - donations only... which did not work. About 300 people came. One pot sold... to me.

However, five years later we set up the Quenington Sculpture Trust as a charity. In 2022, Fresh Air welcomed over 8,000 visitors, and the schools' programme has gone from strength to strength. The aim is to sell the artists' work and encourage every visitor to take pleasure in the rich variety of art in sympathetic surroundings. This year's show opens on 16th June. We very much look forward to seeing you.

"I've built up a bit of debt and I am panicking. Even though I cut back, my spending has gone up and what I have coming in just doesn't stretch as far as it used to. What can I do?"



DEBT – WHAT TO DO

The first step is to collect all the information you have about your debts, this might include contracts, bills and statements.

Next, make a list of your debts and write down the details of each. This could include who you owe money to, when you first missed a payment, and how much you now owe. You'll also need to make a note of your account or reference number, and what steps the person or company has taken to get the money back, such as sending you letters.

If you are behind on household bills, prioritise paying your rent or mortgage, plus energy bills and Council Tax first. Not paying these bills has the most serious consequences. You should speak to the person or company you owe money to, to see if there are any manageable steps you can take to start reducing your debt.

Once you've got these debts under control, you should look at any other debts like credit card or store card debts, payday loans or missed Buy Now Pay Later payments.

NEWS FROM THE ERNEST COOK TRUST

Supporting Outdoor Learning – both locally and nationwide

'Opening Outdoors' is one of three key themes in The Ernest Cook Trust's ambitious new Learning Strategy. It's all about tackling the

barriers to outdoor access and participation which are faced by many young people. We want every child and young person to feel able to connect with nature, particularly those facing mental health difficulties or with neurodiversity; those from minoritised ethnic groups or lower income backgrounds.

One way we do this is by working with young people in small groups, as part of our Nature in Your Stride programme; we are providing support and non-formal learning opportunities to enable young people to engage with nature and thrive outdoors. In fact, we are currently putting Nature in Your Stride into practice in the CHEQS area, through a volunteering programme to help reinstate the ecologically rich habitat of the River Coln, along the 2.86 mile stretch that we manage.



The river as a whole has had a number of pressures placed upon it, from historic management and interventions to abstraction. pollution and poorly managed access. These have led to the gradual degradation of the habitat. Through our progressive stewardship of this popular local landscape we aim to reinstate an ecologically rich habitat, creating learning and social community engagement opportunities.

Over the course of seven weeks in January and February, young adults aged from 18 to 30, are being given the opportunity to learn practical conservation and green skills; they are helping to restore the river, reconnecting with nature, and gaining valuable knowledge.

In other news, work has begun in earnest on the refurbishment of Court Farmhouse, Quenington, which will become our new head office. External works include widening the gateway entrance (a requirement of the planners, to improve visibility) where two trees and some hedging are being removed.
