



The road between Coln and Quenington is due to be closed from 8th to 11th April to allow Thames Water to connect water to the mill. Emergency and pedestrian access will be maintained. The official diversion route is long, as it has to take heavy traffic, but locals will know shorter ways around, or could consider cycling or walking.

Access only from the road by Coln Stores to the mill, then road closed completely. Access only from top of Quenington Hill to just past the road to The Mill House and Upper Mill, then road closed completely.

This is how we can mend broken friendships and maintain the atmosphere of cooperation and sharing that marks our school life.

The day itself was wonderful - everyone made such an effort with their costumes, and all the teachers dressed as Wally or Wanda, from the Where's Wally series of books. A highlight for each child was a workshop (which we shared with Down Ampney School) with the author Tracey Corderoy, writer of the Shifty McGifty and Hubble Bubble books. The children loved her illustrations as much as the stories, and enjoyed having a go at illustrating too. During the rest of the day, we shared extreme reading pictures, searched for Wally, made reading dens, created book characters out of clay or Modroc (Plaster of Paris modelling bandages) and chose books from the reading monitors' book swap. The PTA Wonka Bar sale marked an exciting end to a fantastic day. Huge thanks to the

PTA, all the staff, and Mrs Tipple for masterminding it all. Lucky winners of 'golden tickets' got to join the reading monitors on a trip to the Madhatter Bookshop to spend vouchers kindly donated by Kim Harvey and some of our families. The children chose a fantastic array of books for us all to enjoy.







Another exciting focus this term has been STEM with a K'nex workshop to design and create an innovative recycling vehicle. Ferne and Eva won the challenge and go through to the county final. We also had an organisation called Digibus in school, helping with coding to control robots, website design, and using virtual reality headsets, which was very exciting.



DAVID R ABRAM'S 'AERIAL ATLAS OF ANCIENT BRITAIN'

Gretchen Shoring writes: Please join us for an evening of inspirational images from author and photographer, David R Abram. David has spent the past eleven years capturing views of Britain's most extraordinary prehistoric sites from above, in rare sunrise light, using drones and telescopic poles. Whether Neolithic tombs in the Cotswolds, Bronze Age ceremonial sites in Snowdonia or Iron Age hillforts on the Welsh border, his images reveal forms invisible at ground level, and intriguing connections between the monuments and their varied landscapes.



Lively and rich with archaeological insight, David's talk will cherry-pick highlights from his book, the *Aerial Atlas of Ancient Britain* (published Thames & Hudson, with a Foreword by Professor Alice Roberts), which charts the arc of British prehistory from the end of the Ice Age to the arrival of the Romans. He'll also be sharing sneak previews from his current 'Barrowlands' project, revealing forgotten ceremonial landscapes around the country that can still be walked.

This is a rare opportunity to see David's fabulous photographs projected at scale in the Cotswolds – an experience that is sure to inspire visits to prehistoric sites you already know, and many you don't!

Margaret Davey writes: I have been overwhelmed by the number of people who have attended recent events to bid me farewell as I head for a new adventure in Painswick.



Careful bridleway repair leaves badgers undisturbed

Good news for horse riders and walkers keen to get out into the countryside, as we move into spring and towards summer. Thanks to work by Gloucestershire County Council on a bridleway through land owned by The Ernest Cook Trust, the track is no longer affected by badger activity, which was potentially putting horses and riders and risk. And the badgers themselves have been unaffected, as all the work carried out was done so carefully, under licence from Natural England.

The work on a 250m stretch through Smeril Plantation, in Eastleach Valley, took place last November. It was led by the Public Rights of Way Team at the County Council, and the Trust was very happy to facilitate this. The work involved rerouting sett entrances to beyond the path boundary, using robust plastic tubing. The path overhead was wire meshed and stoned, to prevent the badgers digging back through, and to make the bridleway fit for use.

So far so good, with badgers carrying on their normal activities undisturbed, with the path no longer affected by badger damage. Only the sections where the setts are on, or close to, the path were altered, but the Trust and the Council will keep a careful eye, in case other sections also need rerouting.



The work is a great example of how the natural world and people can live alongside one another in harmony. So, why not take the opportunity with longer days and (hopefully) better weather to get outside and explore the countryside. 
