



Carson, my fox-red lab pup, and I moved to Quenington last October. Carson was just three months old when we moved in, so it was a big adventure for both of us.

I was brought up in Gloucestershire. I'd been living in Stroud, and was looking for a change. I spread the net wide and within two months, the perfect house came up in Quenington. The deal was sealed for me when I came over one Saturday afternoon in June. As I walked to The Keepers Arms, everyone was so friendly and once in the pub, I chatted to Jon about the village. I sat in the glorious sunshine with my drink, feeling blissfully happy... then drove straight to Cirencester and offered on the house!

When I moved in, I'd just finished a five-and-a-half-year contract with Lloyds Banking Group, working as a scheduler and planner on large-scale projects. The end of my contract has given me an opportunity for some down time to settle into my new house and train my pup. Previously, I had worked in training, estate agency and interiors.

Many of you in Quenington will have met Carson and me out on our walks. For those of you who wonder "why Carson?" he's named after the butler in Downton Abbey with a nod to my previous gorgeous lab, Butler, who I lost last year.

Eighteen months ago, I took over as chairman of my late father's trust. My father was a GP in Gloucester, and my parents were passionate about Africa. I have followed in that passion. We had been supporting a hospital in Malawi for over 10 years but moved our support to the Abato Foundation in Uganda just before Covid hit. 'Abato' means children in Luganda, the largest spoken local language. In February this year, my cousin and I finally visited Uganda and the Foundation – a primary and secondary school, a farm, and a medical centre. We got to see first-hand the many things we had supplied for them, including a well. The standard of education in the schools is incredible - every child in their uniform, keen to learn, working hard, having been given the opportunity to go to school. We met some incredible people and learnt so much about the culture. A truly humbling experience. We're already planning our return trip next February.



This month's talk with be given by Sue Smith, on the Friends Ambulance Unit (FAU) in the World Wars. The FAU was a volunteer ambulance service set up to provide alternative service to fighting. It was founded by Quakers, in line with their Peace Testimony, during the First World War when universal conscription first became compulsory. It operated during both world wars and beyond, in many countries in Europe, Asia and Africa. It took some years to become accepted, but by the end of the Second World War, Quakers had been awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for their non-partisan work providing humanitarian relief.



COLN MILL DIARIES: #4



Rob & Helen Forbes write: Passers-by will have finally started to see some real progress at Coln Mill, with local resident Callum David working his magic on the pointing, the restored windows going back in, the doors sanded and the roof repairs in full swing. However, progress has been hampered by a wet winter, a shoddy roof, relentless damp, rotting timbers, and convoluted water and energy supply issues. This has led to far greater ground works and repairs than anticipated, with associated wallets and patience tested! Our ability to do the project sustainably has also been hamstrung, with the listed status of the building and associated conservation area meaning that things like double glazing and solar panels are simply a non-starter. Thankfully, we are well on our way now though, with the interior fully stripped back, first fix electrics in place and traditional lime plastering to commence imminently.



One bit of prime real estate renovation that has been expedited is the bat house B&B; situated in a desirable countryside location, this three room semi-detached residence boasts a beautiful summer roost with ensuite hibernation facilities (entry via the new bespoke door) and a palatial penthouse suite (see hole on gable end), thereby providing an attractive year round proposition for our furry friends. It's perhaps not surprising therefore that our first lucky lesser horseshoe bat has already moved in and is looking frisky.

While the renovation of the miller's cottages progresses, we are also pulling together the planning application for the mill itself. The restoration of this promises to be really exciting, and we just hope Cotswold District Council will be supportive of the minor changes we are proposing to improve internal accessibility, so that the old mill can be fully appreciated in action.

Lastly, apologies for the inconvenience of the recent road closure and any other disruption caused - claim some flour from us (sometime in the next decade or two!).

The summer term is always a lovely time in school. After SATs are over, the Year 4s, 5s and 6s will be off for a residential trip to the Wilderness Centre in the Forest of Dean, along with pupils from Bibury and North Cerney schools. Activities will include a wildlife safari, orienteering, crate stacking, a night walk and a campfire. While they



are away the rest of the school will be doing an enrichment project based around the theme of the Olympic Games.

We are now able to get up to the field each week for our sports lessons and after-school club. In addition, we are keen for all our pupils to experience some alternative sports. The Swans are taking whole class archery lessons.

The Cygnets are doing Balanceability, a programme designed to help children gain the confidence and skills required to cycle independently. They start with balance bikes and move on to pedal bikes.



We are refurbishing our wildlife

garden with new edging and gravel. It will be open for Southrop Open Gardens on 18th & 19th May. Do come and take a look – it is at its best in May, with the froth of cow parsley, which will be taller than many of our children by then! Thanks to AK Timms for donating the gravel. We also thank David Chapman and Kathy Newton for the time they have spent preparing the team for the Gloucestershire Wildlife Quiz. Our school hosted the first round, competing against St Lawrence School.

In the Swan classroom the topic this term is 'What did the Ancient Greeks ever do for us?'. We have discovered the answer is "Quite a bit!": democracy, the Olympic Games, theatre, philosophy, our alphabet and much more. We will conclude the topic by getting dressed up for Ancient Greek Day where a "real" Ancient Greek visitor will teach us about the battles with the Persians and training for combat, and will help us organise our own Olympic Games.

The Cygnets are in for a treat as we delve into Queen Victoria's 63 year reign and explore the differences between Victorian Britain versus Britain today. We will also visit Sevrington Victorian School in Wiltshire, to find out what it was really like to be a schoolchild in those times.



NEWS FROM THE ERNEST COOK TRUST

Supporting Outdoor Learning – both locally and nationwide

Young people who have been attending The Ernest Cook Trust's Student Workshop,

learning as part of our Skills for Nature programme, will once again be exhibiting alongside Quenington's biennial Fresh Air Sculpture. Around 25 young people, from schools in Fairford, Cirencester and Witney, have been spending time at our Fairford head office site creating some wonderful sculptures from reclaimed materials and materials grown on our estates. The students' pieces will be on show in St Swithin's Churchyard, near the entrance to Fresh Air Sculpture, and their collection will represent a wildlife park. There will be an



array of insect and bug homes and feeders; owl and bat boxes; and bird feeding stations. A section of the show will be dedicated to animals, and feature a life-sized



gorilla made from roofing battens and ivy, as well as a tiger, a lion and a giant seahorse! Some of the materials are reclaimed and come from the Trust's estates, including oak from felled deadwood, ivy removed from tree trunks, coppiced hazel, and junk metal. The students have also made a range of benches, so there will be plenty of places to sit and picnic and enjoy the artwork, before or after visiting the main Fresh Air Sculpture exhibition.

Pete Tatham, one of The Ernest Cook Trust's Outdoor Learning Officers in Gloucestershire, said the students had been working hard to produce some incredible artwork to put on show. "We've picked a wildlife theme, and have a really eclectic mix of pieces," he said. "The students are aged between 12 to 19, and some we have worked with for as long as four years, teaching skills that they wouldn't be able to learn in school. They are all working towards a range of employability awards."

The majority of the exhibits are being shown for the first time and have been made by our current students. The giant metal seahorse was created by two students who have now left education and gone on to become apprentice blacksmiths following a blacksmithing training course run in partnership with Fresh Air last year.

This year's Fresh Air Sculpture runs from 16 June to 7 July, and we are once again pleased to be supporting Fresh Air Sculpture's education programme.

MACARONI WOOD Noah's Ark Children's Venture

The name 'Macaroni' is said to come from the term used to describe a fashionable fellow in 18th century Britain. During this time, an area near

Macaroni Wood was used as a race course. Men would visit from London to race their horses and would come dressed in the flamboyant Italian 'Macaroni' style.

RAF Southrop requisitioned the woods at the start of World War II. During this time 1,500 people lived in the woods. The site was decommissioned in 1947. Before becoming abandoned, the buildings were used for accommodating visiting groups of children and young people during the 1960s, including – significantly – a group from London called Deptford Adventure Playground. This group went on to found The Noah's Ark Children's



Venture (Macaroni Wood) in the early 1970s with the aim of providing high-quality, low-cost short-stay residential breaks to groups working with children, young people, and adults from the inner cities and elsewhere. The site was then owned by Sir Thomas Bazley, who leased the property. The full-repairing lease means the charity has the responsibility for anything which needs doing to the site and buildings. His estate changed hands in 2007, and is now owned by The Ernest Cook Trust.

Hannah Garbutt, Outdoor Education and Volunteer manager, writes:

Many CHEQS residents drive past the Macaroni Wood sign and wonder, 'what goes on there?'

Over time the site has been developed to provide a residential facility for disabled children and young people. As a registered charity, our aim is to make a positive difference to the lives of children and young people. We do this by providing residential and outdoor learning experiences in 18 acres of woodland, promoting health and wellbeing. We are proud to say that over 50 years more than 60,000 children have stayed onsite.





As you can imagine, there is always plenty to do in the woods. If you can spare a few hours a week we would really appreciate your help. Tasks include:

- Woodland management on Tuesday afternoons
- Bicycle maintenance Thursday mornings
- Allotment care on Wednesday afternoons

We are also looking for a volunteer to help with our online second-hand goods store.

Finally, we would also like to support two Duke of Edinburgh volunteers. Let us know if you are interested and what skills you could share.

Forthcoming events include a dusk bat walk in the summer, our 50th Anniversary Fete on Tuesday, 13th August, and a fungi foraging walk in the autumn.
